

Expected Behavior

Here at St Rose of Lima, our faith formation classes share facilities with our School and many other Parish Ministries. It is imperative that each student understands what proper expected behavior is and what will not be accepted. Below you will find a list of expected behavior. No list can cover every circumstance and students are expected to follow the instructions of their teacher at all times.

Before Class:

- No running
- Enter the classroom in a quiet and orderly manner
- Follow the directions of your teacher and wait in the place they designate for class to start

During Class:

- No food, drinks, or gum chewing is allowed during class sessions
- Sit in your assigned seat
- Remain seated with your feet on the floor
- Keep your hands and feet to yourself-Do not touch others
- Speak one at a time-Do not interrupt others
- Remain silent when the teacher or someone else is speaking
- Keep your voice low- No shouting or yelling
- Do not use sarcastic or inappropriate comments
- Return crayons, pencils, and any other classroom supplies neatly and to their designated place

Property of Others:

- Always be respectful of Church grounds and property
- DO NOT touch or remove anything from the desks
- Do not touch the items on display in the classrooms
- Sit only in the designated seats-Do not sit on the tops of desks, counters, or tables
- Stay off the grass outside the classrooms- Always use the sidewalks

After Class:

- Children must be picked up at their classroom and signed out
- Only those individuals designated on the application may sign a child out
- Children will not be released from their class early for any reason- Early pick-up MUST be arranged through the office
- Walk; do not run to your car

Students are expected to bring their books to every class session. They are also expected to complete any and all assignments asked for by their teacher. Students that exhibit proper behavior will receive positive affirmation from their teachers and periodic rewards may be given.

Consequences for Misbehavior

We expect that all students will be respectful of their teachers, fellow students, and anyone assisting the teacher in the classroom. If a student begins to exhibit poor behavioral standards in class, the following will occur:

Occasional misbehavior will be corrected by the teacher

Consistent instances of misbehavior:

1. Sent to the Office to speak with the Director
2. Sent to the Office, parents will be notified
3. Parent will be required to remain in the classroom if the student is to remain in the program.

Each child is a unique gift from God and has their unique needs. Some children may require another year of maturity before beginning their preparation. Students that have persistent behavioral issues may not yet be ready for sacramental preparation in a structured catechetical program.
